









benefits provide temporary financial assistance as determined by federal and state legislation for eligible workers who are unemployed through no fault of their own.

Initial Claim – A request for determination of entitlement for unemployment insurance benefits when a break in job attachment has occurred.

Continued Claim — A request for benefit payment or a notice filed to obtain credit for a waiting period week.

First Payment — Counts of individuals for whom states have decided to make at least one Unemployment Insurance payment. This is the measure generally used as a proxy for new entrants to the system.

Final Payment — Occurs when a claimant receives a payment that reduces their account balance to zero in a particular program and exhausts their entitlement in that program.

Weeks Paid — The total number of requests for a week of compensation by UI claimants who have eligibility.

Benefits Paid — Unemployment compensation paid to individuals under a state program, usually the first 26 weeks of benefits. This total will be for all weeks compensated in these programs, including partial payments. This total does not include UCFE or UCX, Trade, DUA or any sort of extended or Federal benefit program.

Average Weekly Benefit – Amount paid to individuals receiving unemployment insurance payments, excluding partial weeks.



The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the South rose 0.2 percent in April, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. The monthly increase in the all items index was influenced by increases in the gasoline and shelter indexes. (Data in this report are not seasonally adjusted. Accordingly, month-to-month changes reflect the impact of seasonal influences.)

The all items CPI-U for the South increased 3.3 percent for the 12 months ending in April, after increasing 3.8 percent for the 12-month period ending in March. The index for all items less food and energy advanced 3.6 percent over the past 12 months. The food index and the energy index also increased over the past year, up 2.0 percent and 1.7 percent, respectively.


