About the National, State, Metropolitan, and Nonmetropolitan Area Occupational Employment and Wage Estimates

The National, State, Metropolitan, and Nonmetropolitan Area Occupational Employment and Wage Estimates are calculated from data collected in a national survey of employers. Data on occupational employment and wages are collected from employers of every size, in every state, in metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas, in all industry sectors. These estimates are cross-industry estimates; each occupation's employment and wage estimates are calculated from data collected from employers in all industry sectors. Self-employed persons are not included in the survey or estimates. The May 2020 OEWS estimates are based on a "hybrid" structure that is a combination of the 2010 and 2018 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) system, and are based on the Office of Management and Budget's revised metropolitan area definitions, based on the results of the 2010 decennial census.

The National, State, Metropolitan, and Nonmetropolitan Area Occupational Employment and Wage Estimates consist of the following:

SOC Code Number: the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) system's unique, six-digit (plus hyphen) numerical identifier for each occupation.

Occupation Title: a descriptive title that corresponds to the SOC code.

Employment: the estimated total occupational employment (not including self-employed).

Mean Hourly Wage: the estimated total hourly wages of an occupation divided by its estimated employment, i.e., the average hourly wage.

Mean Annual Wage: the estimated total annual wages of an occupation divided by its estimated employment, i.e., the average annual wage.

Percentile Wage Estimates: (National estimates only) A percentile wage estimate shows what percentage of workers in an occupation earn less than a given wage and what percentage earn more. For example, a 25th percentile wage of \$15.00 indicates that 25 percent of workers (in a given occupation in a given area) earn less than \$15.00; therefore 75 percent of workers earn more than \$15.00.
