About the 2021 State, Metropolitan, and Nonmetropolitan Area Occupational Employment and Wage Estimates

The Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) program produces employment and wage estimates annually. OEWS estimates are calculated from data collected from employers in every size, in all industry sectors, and in metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas in Mississippi. Self-employed persons are not included in the survey or estimates.

The May 2021 OEWS estimates were the first OEWS estimates based solely on survey data collected using the 2018 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) system. The metropolitan area estimates use the Office of Management and Budget's revised metropolitan area definitions based on the results of the 2010 decennial census. With the May 2021 estimates, the OEWS program now uses a new estimation methodology. The new model-based estimation methodology, called MB3, has advantages over the previous methodology, as described in the August 2019 Monthly Labor Review article "[Model-based estimates for the Occupational Employment Statistics program.](#)"

Estimates for detailed occupations do not sum to the totals because the totals include occupations not shown separately. Wages for some occupations that do not generally work year-round, full time, are reported either as hourly wages or annual salaries depending on how they are typically paid.
